

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Mini Griffins & Pre-School

This term Mini Griffins learning has been based around their topic 'Shadows and Reflections.' At the beginning of Spring 1, the Mini Griffins enjoyed learning about the story of Peter Pan. During this story, we explored dark and colourful shadows. Making links with the topic, they also enjoyed looking at their own reflections in mirrors and recognising when we may see a reflection in the world around us.

To develop our number skills, we enjoyed learning to count our numbers and recognising them by matching a total number of objects to the correct numeral. To support this, we have had fun using a light board playing 'Kim's Game' which helped us notice changes of amounts up to 3: this was really exciting! As well as this, the Mini Griffins have also been continuing to develop their gross motor skills by practising to kick and throw a ball.

What a wonderful start to Spring term in Mini Griffins: we are very proud of how you have each flourished and are constantly adapting to the routines of the provision. We look forward to seeing what Spring 2 brings!

Reception & Year 1

Reception have had a busy start to 2024 and within Maths have had a big focus on shapes. They looked at many different shapes and identified how many sides they have along with their names. Following this, we went on a shape hunt around the classroom to see which shapes we could find in every day objects. We also learnt about composing shapes and decomposing them: learning that shapes can be made up of lots of smaller shapes too. The children were very creative and created their own pictures in art applying shapes that they are familiar with. To build on their learning, they also had an exciting lesson using pin boards and hammers to create shapes, recapping their previous learning.

Reception also took part in NSPCC Number Day where we completed some simple exercises that we had to independently count. On this day, we went on a number hunt in the outdoor area exploring numbers in nature, encouraging our Griffins to observe and identify many different digits, whilst developing their observation skills. They also completed an outdoor challenge where they had to complete various physical tasks such as jumping, lunging, twirling and even had to see how many they could do in ten seconds!







In Maths this half-term, Year 1 have been looking at Place value to 50 as well as addition and subtraction. The children have been taking part in lots of Active Maths sessions and have enjoyed extending their learning, outside of the classroom, and onto the playground; the children especially enjoyed using big hoops and chalk outside for some mathematical fun!


have also been solving missing number problems in part-whole models. The children have had to apply their addition and subtraction knowledge to work out trickier sums using number lines and part-whole models.














What fantastic learning Year 1!





Year 2 & Year 3

Year 2's maths learning has mostly been focused on money throughout Spring 1. We did lots of practical work with counting coins, making different amounts and investigating different ways to make a pound. We also learnt methods for calculating the difference between different amounts of money and working out change.

We finished our money topic with a Moneysense lesson, where we discussed the importance of saving money. We looked at various scenarios and the children had to decide whether they would save or spend the money they had, and the pros and cons of each decision. The children really enjoyed thinking about the real life applications of our learning. We wonder, will they apply this to what they do with their pocket money at home?

What incredible learning, Year 2. It is wonderful to hear how you are developing both your Maths and life skills throughout your lessons. Keep up the fantastic work!





In maths this half term, Year 3 have continued to investigate aspects of their multiplication and division topic. The Year 3 Griffins have focused on consolidating their knowledge of the 2, 4, 8 and 10x tables and had opportunity to deepen their understanding of these by experimenting with hands on resources in a number of practical and collaborative lessons.

Moving on from this, the children have looked at the links between multiplication and division by investigating related calculations. They have built upon their learning and understanding of multiplication to successfully being able to multiply a 2-digit number by a 1 digit number, applying the formal method of short multiplication. Year 3 also had great fun on NSPCC Number Day, completing a class wide multiplication sentence matching activity!






Year 4 & Year 5

This half term, Year 4 have seen their confidence in multiplication and division soar as they have discovered new concepts to help build their fluency. After perfecting our column method and bus stop method with three-digit numbers, we have applied our knowledge through discovering patterns, solving puzzles and recognised the practical applications for multiplication and division in everyday life.

Also during Spring 1, we celebrated NSPCC Number Day by enjoying the fun side of mathematics through counting cards in Uno, calculating probabilities in Higher or Lower, strategising grid coordinates in Battleships, and applying our four processes in Countdown - it most certainly was a busy day! Thanks to our competitive students, we have been able to improve our math concepts through strategy, problem-solving, mental maths and pattern recognition while having lots of fun!



This half term, Year 5 we have been learning about multiplication, division and fractions. We have been utilising the formal column method of multiplication and the bus stop method in short division. We then moved onto multiplying unit fractions, non-unit fractions and identifying mixed numbers and improper fractions. We have spent time applying our learning to various problem-solving and reasoning problems to link learning to real life.

I am so impressed with the progress our Year 5 Griffins have made over this Spring half term in their


Year 6 & Thrive




