Throughout this half-term, our youngest Griffins have been learning all about water. We have looked at various different water-based themes and enjoyed lots of activities too. The children made their very own Rainbow Fish with Miss B - they used a variety of materials and absolutely loved it! We also read the story of Rainbow Fish during group time, and learned that it makes us happier when we share with our friends. This has been lovely to see among the provision and witnessing our Griffins sharing, turn taking and being kind to one another makes us incredibly proud.

We have also played Maths games using different 'Under the Sea' creatures, explored texture trays with coloured rice and walks across the school fields.

The final week of term involved lots of celebrations for the Queens Jubilee. Our Griffins created their own crowns, learned about the United Kingdom and made decorations in preparation for our school picnic.

We had so much fun and wish the Queen a very happy Jubilee!





This half term, we have used the topic 'Big Wide World' to develop our knowledge and understanding of the world and to recognise and discuss the similarities and differences between ourselves and others whilst developing our sense of community.

We have taken a literacy walk around the world, crossing continent to continent using stories such as 'Handa's Surprise', 'Rumble in the Jungle' and 'Remena's Ramadan' to spark conversation and discussion. We've ended our journey back in the UK to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee by creating art portraits, designing new residences for Her Royal Highness and role playing our own street parties in the nursery garden.

Pre-School have demonstrated a high level of learning and we are all really proud of how hard they have worked this half term: we wish them a wonderful half-term holiday with their families and cannot wait for them to return for their final Summer half-term.



Reception

This half term Reception have been focusing on the changes of the season through their topic 'What Can You See In Summer?' Throughout their school year, Reception have been keeping a keen eye on their outdoor areas and explored how their surroundings change throughout the seasons. With our new topic we have been looking forward to see what signs of Summer look like and what we have to look forward to. The children have used all of their senses to immerse themselves into their topic, and learn all about Summer.

Throughout Reception have made mosaic lollipops, experimented with water and sand, and learned how to stay safe in the sun. Fitting for Summer, we have spent lots of our time in our beautiful outdoor environment where the children have learned to build structures with tools, plant flowers and vegetables, and worked together to create and manoeuvre obstacle courses throughout our learning areas. Our Reception Griffins have been learning how to be valuable members of our school: we chose to litter pick around our school grounds to ensure the environment is clean for all. Reception have loved learning all about Summer and are excited to expand their knowledge even further with our next topic 'Who Lives In A Rockpool' where we will be investigating beaches and sea life.





## Year 1

This half term our topic in Year 1 has been 'The Enchanted Woodland:' we have been looking at fairy tales including, 'Little Red Riding Hood' and 'Hansel and Gretal.' Within this, the children have been making their own maps, developing their own keys, and they have also been beginning to write their own short narratives. In Art lessons the children have been designing their own enchanted woodland puppets and they have been exploring how to join materials together ready to make their chosen animal puppets. As part of an International school link, we have been looking at the Elephant Parade. The children had lots of fun researching Asian Elephants: they created fact files, their own stories about elephants and save the elephant posters. Furthermore, they designed their own elephants and decorated them.


In Science lessons, we have been learning about different common plants and trees. The children have been exploring the outdoors and had a hunt for the different plants that they could find and identify. Alongside this, the children planted seed bombs as part of our outdoor learning day following our study of global warming within PSHE!

## Year 2

During Summer 1, Year 2 have been learning all about the 'Scented Garden'. We kick started the half-term by visiting the Botanical Gardens in Leicester. This was a great way to initially engage the children in the topic and they were thrilled to take part in the various activities organised for them. Whilst at the Botanical Gardens, the children: looked at plants and their everyday uses; created sculptures identifying the main parts of a plant; and planted cress seeds. This is certainly an outing that the children will remember!

Back in the classroom, we have been learning about plants in more detail. We have identified parts of plants (including ones we eat), studied the life cycle of a plant, and investigated the best conditions for growing plants. The children have demonstrated a real passion for understanding how plants grow and why they are important.

As part of our Topic, we have also studied the Artist Van Gogh, who is famous for his 'Sunflower' painting, amongst other things. We have been developing our skills in using various art mediums and applied our learning to a recreating of the 'Sunflower' painting.







This half term, Year 3 have been studying four figure grid references on maps and finding locations. They have also learnt about different predators including bird predators. From this, the children went out to observe what the grounds of the school might look like from a bird's eye view and then mapped out the locations of different things such as the trim trail and the forest school on a grid map.

During Art lessons the children have linked their predator topic to produce different animal skin designs drawn from what they could see through a view finder, to really focus on a small section. First the children sketched the section they chose into their sketch books using their sketching and shading skills, before enlarging the small view onto a larger piece of art paper. During Science lessons the children have looked at the life cycles of flowering plants and what the function of each part plays in the life cycle. They were able to explain their findings and understand that all science experiments do not work and need to be repeated to test out their predictions.

The children have had a lot of fun experimenting this half term and have learned many scientific facts.



## Year 4

Our topic this half term has been '1066.' We have been learning about the transfer of power in England from the Saxons to the Normans. Our work has included making a timeline of the events of 1066. This included looking at historical sources about the Battle of Hastings, and considering whether they could be relied upon to be true. We also designed and made a book cover in the style of the Domesday Book, using cold water paste and etching a pattern onto it to create a 3d effect. Continuing with the theme of the Domesday Book, we created our own survey for what could be included in a modern version. We have also learnt about Norman Motte and Bailey castles and what life was like for those who lived there. We wrote a diary extract to show how we think a serf would have felt, working for a Norman baron.


## Year 5

In Year 5, our topic for this half term is 'Hola Mexico!' We began by identifying where Mexico is in North America, along with other countries in this vast continent and showed this on a map. We also investigated and identified famous landmarks too, such as the Rocky mountains, Mount Rushmore and The Whitehouse to name a few.

During Design Technology learning, we designed and created our own marble runs using recyclable materials. It was trickier than it looked as we had to make them sturdy enough to stand freely, and we had to design a run that would enable a marble to begin at the top and get all the way to the bottom. Our challenge was to then get the marble to the top again without touching it. We all worked together and showed exemplary teamwork shills!

Our Year 5 Griffins have also been eagerly preparing for their transition to Year 6 which has involved considering any future Pupil Leadership Roles within the school. The children have been asked to provide a rationale as to why they should be accepted into the role by the start of Summer 2: we cannot wait to see what they come up with!

Keep up the hard work Year 5!



### Year 6

In Year 6, most of the half term has focussed on completing the SATs: we are incredibly proud of all of the children for their focused, mature and determined attitude to complete each test to the very best of their ability. Despite having two years of interrupted education and not having covered as much of the curriculum as previous cohorts, our Year 6 Griffins approached every test with the self-belief and a determination to achieve highly. The tests have all now been packaged up and sent away for marking, however regardless of the results and the outcome, we are truly proud of our Year 6 children for the effort that they have shown.

Tests only ever measure a tiny proportion of the curriculum and of what we value and endeavour to teach our children. Other things, such as some of our school values of kindness, honesty, respect, empathy and just being an all-round good person are not measured by SATs but are equally as important.

Well done Year 6! Now to enjoy the rest of your time with us at Park Lane: leavers' events, the residential and lots more wonderful learning opportunities!





## The Nurture Team



This half-term Forest School have been focusing on creating a blackberry fence: this will help to make it safer for children to harvest the fruit in the future. Our Griffins have also been helping take down the low-over hanging branches to enable a safer environment for children to learn and explore new skills. Such kindness and generosity shown!

Challenge 26

What is Challenge 26? Every year, we ask all students to set themselves a sporting challenge involving the number 26 and to collect sponsorship to go towards our collective fundraising effort. This year we will be

raising money for Get Kids Going. Get Kids Going is a national charity which gives disabled children and young people, up to the age of 26 years, the wonderful opportunity of participating in sport. They provide them with specifically designed sports wheelchairs so that they can partake in: athletics, marathons, tennis, skiing, curling, rugby, sailing, boccia, basketball, snowboarding, table tennis, fencing, shooting, archery, powerlifting and many more sports. Get Kids Going inspires disabled youngsters to compete in sporting events, from start to paralympic level, by also giving them sports grants to help with their training, physiotherapy, sports psychology, travel, competition fees and the design and development of sports' equipment. With your help, many can become world record holders and paralympic champions.

It was fantastic to see all of our Griffins excited and enjoying their learning!






### Apetito Tasting
