Our Mini Griffins enjoyed walks through our school woodland area, using their eyes and ears to look and listen to the animals. The children collected natural materials from the forest floor and we took them back to Nursery to create pictures. We sat and watched some short clips about the work David Attenborough has completed, looking at different animals and their habitats. We also had a visit from Cool Critters: Phil explained about different animals, where they lived, what they are and they were ever allowed to touch the animals too - lots of brave Griffins!

For our GAF performance, we collated a montage of all the fun things that we had completed throughout and showed parents this on our iPads. Overall, we had lots of fun learning about how we can do little things to make a change for the better in our world.

What a phenomenal year Mini Griffins - it has been a pleasure observing your develop!



Over our GAF fortnight, our Pre-School Griffins have been focusing upon the work of 'Sir David Attenborough'. This particular Change Maker really interested Pre-Schools' curious minds as we explored the pioneering work he has accomplished over his life time. Our children were particularly moved by a scene from Our Planet, where Sir David showed us the melting artic ice cap, with a lone polar bear struggling to find ice to live and hunt on. This sparked conversation about what we can do to help save the polar bears, other animals, and ultimately, our planet. We discovered there is lots of thing we can change to help however, we began by looking a little closer to home and helped the wildlife in our nursery garden by ensuring it was litter free; we even discovered a rabbit is living there!

We were lucky enough to have a visit from Phil at Cool Critters, who brought along some amazing animals for us to meet, such as Spiders, Tree Frogs, Snakes and Lizards: it was wonderful to see our very own budding Attenboroughs! Peaking our interest in animals large and small, we focused our art work on creating both a land and sea animal frieze for our GAF showcase, including crabs, octopi and fish, monkeys, sloths and snakes.

Well done on becoming Change Makers yourselves Pre-School and for a fantastic year filled with learning!



Reception

For our Griffin Arts Festival this year, Reception have been celebrating the legacy of 'Amelia Earhart.' After investigating this Change Maker, the children decided they would like to create old-fashioned aeroplane sculptures to display for their community. Reception repurposed recycled goods to create unique aircrafts with cardboard, wood, and lots of paint. To showcase our aviator, the children experimented with different chalks, crayons, waxes, and powered paints to produce portraits of Earhart.

Reception have loved learning all about the skies, and have demonstrated a mix of artistic styles that they have developed over the year to represent their knowledge of the world above us as they have constructed birds with feathers, bees with beads, and cotton wool clouds for their art pieces. The children have excitedly spent their Griffin University this term rehearsing performance art pieces for the festival. RJE have been looking into famous poets, reading and reciting poetry, with a special piece ready to perform to parents, and RST have enjoyed singing lessons to belt out their song which celebrates all change makers.

It has been a pleasure watching your grown throughout this year Reception: you will all be wonderful in Year 1!



For our GAF celebrations, we looked at the Change Maker, 'Steve Irwin.' The children began the festivities by using different sources to research who Steve Irwin was. Following on from this, the children then wrote their very own fact files all about Steve Irwin. Furthermore, the children had lots of fun creating their own acrostic animal poems. We also took part in lots of Art activities using different mediums: we created our own animal prints using oil pastels, created jelly fish using the bubble paint method and painted our own crocodiles.

Year 1 also did some research on endangered animals and created a rhino collage full of endangered animals. Furthermore, we created jelly fish out of paper plates and bubble wrap! Lastly, Year 1 had an amazing time taking part in an animal dance workshop and they created a dance to the Little Mermaid's 'Under the Sea'.

The children had lots of fun performing this to their grown ups and did a fantastic job - what a year you've had Year 1!



Year 2

In Year 2, our Change Maker was 'Charles Darwin'. As part of our work on our Change Maker, we learnt all about evolution and natural selection. We began by researching Charles Darwin's life and showing our understanding through freezeframes. We also used this knowledge to create word silhouette's full of key words about Charles Darwin and his life. In our English lessons, we also looked at the features of a Kenning's poem and created our very own poetry all about apes.

We created fossils out of clay, thinking carefully about their markings and then painted these using natural colours. Throughout GAF, we developed our photography skills, which included a visit from a Nicholas Chamberlain photography student as well as a visit to Nicholas Chamberlain's photography studio for some selected children. We used our new photography skills to recreate the stages of human evolution. Finally, we developed our portrait drawing skills and applied these to create self-portraits that were half ape and half us.

It has been a great yet and your curiosity to learn fills us with so much pride Year 2 - all the very best in Year 3!



Year 3

For the theme of Change Makers - GAF festival 22, Year 3 researched the campaigner for change 'Greta Thunberg.' She campaigns for climate change all over the world, sometimes in front of World Leaders and we think she is a very inspirational young lady. After learning what changes she wants world leaders to make, we looked closer to home and what changes we could campaign for at school. We realised that paper waste is huge not just in Park Lane but all over the world, so we decided to try and get our Head of School to help us make a change by recycling paper.

To do this we each wrote a letter of protest and suggested ways that we can make a change. Miss Ladbury read our letters, listened to our suggestions, and replied in a very positive way. Year 3 were delighted to be told that there will be a recycling centre introduced to Park Lane in the near future due to our demands.

We have successfully helped to make a change at Park Lane - well done Year 3!





Year 4

In Year 4 during GAF, we learned about the inspirational Mexican artist 'Frida Kahlo.' Frida experienced a great deal of pain and difficulty in her life. She suffered from Polio at the age of six, and was injured in a road accident when she was eighteen. She had to stay in bed for several months. Despite this, she showed real resilience and developed her talent in drawing and painting, focusing on self-portraits. She was ground-breaking in the ways she changed people's views of women artists and artists with disabilities. We painted our to own self-portraits in the style of Frida Kahlo, made Mexican style ponchos and performed a Mexican dance. We also took part in a drama workshop, and acted out scenes from Frida Kahlo's life.

You've each grown wonderfully this year Year 4, we wish you the best as you transition to Year 5!

Year 5

Our GAF theme this year was 'Changemakers' and Year 5 chose 'John Lennon' as their person. We chose him as he used his celebrity status to highlight the need for World Peace and he was an instrumental member of the Peace Movement. He was also an active anti-war campaigner and staged a 'BED-in' with his wife (Yoko Ono) to protest against the war in Vietnam in 1969.

To celebrate John Lennon and his achievements to promote change, we were lucky to have Mr Hutt (who is a talented artist) come in and work with the children on sketched portraits. They looked at where the features of a face should go and the children produced some great sketches. They then used these new skills to create colour portraits using a variety of resources, looking at the work of other artists – old and modern.

The children then listened to John Lennon's most famous song, Imagine. They explored the lyrics and then created their own version, thinking about what they would change about the world today. The results were simply stunning. We collated all those ideas and created a class version, which we sung at the GAF. Year 5 believe that John Lennon really was a Changemaker!

A fantastic Year - we are sure that you will achieve wonderful things in Year 6!



Year 6

Throughout the Griffin Arts Festival, Year 6 have focused on our Change Maker: 'Martin Luther King Jr.' We explored his crucial work in furthering the civil rights movement in the USA, considered the implications for today and imagined our own dreams for the future. This was a rewarding experience with our Year 6 Griffins approaching the topics with a maturity that shows they will be ready for their next step into secondary in September.

Year 6 developed a range of art inspired by our Change Maker including: art using a focal point to develop the illusion of three dimensions; a photography project (A Day at Park Lane), where pupils honed their skills and then captured life at Park Lane; 'I Have a Dream Too' - monologues written as an update to MLK's famous speech; and collaborative artworks using mixed mediums to create murals of MLK.

Birmingham GAF

During the Summer Term, some of our Year 5 Griffins entered an Arts competition to be chosen to attend the Griffin Arts Festival Experience in Birmingham. The selected winners - who collectively had some fantastic entries - went on a 3 day residential of Arts experiences.

The children were exposed to many arts experiences, the first of which was a pottery session at Nicholas Chamberlaine school - one of our local trust secondary schools in Bedworth. Within the workshop, they created clay poppies and coral reefs before moving onto a Shakespeare Workshop with company Odd Socks. They had the opportunity to look at the Shakespeare play Macbeth.

After an enjoyable first nights sleep, our Griffins headed off for a busy day in Birmingham. Their first stop was at the Botanical Gardens where they took part in an art workshop based around the artist Andy Goldsworthy, looking at using natural materials to create a piece of art. They then moved into the butterfly house to complete a sketching activity before finally enjoying a picnic on the beautiful lawns. They were surprised to be joined by a special visitor - one of the peacocks - who was keen to see what everyone was enjoying for their lunch!

They then continued their tour of Birmingham at the Barber Institute of Fine Arts where they had the opportunity to learn about different painting styles and have a go at sketching in the style of the artist.

Following this, they then visited the Lapworth Museum of Geology where they completed an arts award activity. They searched the museum for facts about fossils, dinosaurs and minerals.

The following day, our Year 5 Birmingham GAF children visited the Symphony Hall for a jazz workshop and to learn some samba body percussion. They then continued their venture ardour Birmingham, even at one point bumping into Perry the bull - the mascot for the Commonwealth games. They had a tour of the Ikon gallery looking at some incredible architecture before returning to Nicholas Chamberlaine for the night at the proms. Their residential concluded with an incredible finale performance from the Ratby Co-operative band.

During the evening, we were thrilled that Megan - one of our Year 2
Griffins - joined us alongside her family to be presented with her
award for her winning entry to the Griffin Schools Trust
Monologue competition. Congratulations to Megan, once again!

Attendance

New government guidance was issued in May 2022 about school attendance and how schools should manage it, and it is clear that the government see this as a key issue affecting children's education and something they are keen for schools to tackle robustly.

During the COVID pandemic, schools' approaches to attendance temporarily shifted as we all tried to cope with the challenges such a disaster threw at us. Now that

things are more stable, it is important that we all start the incoming school year in September with a positive attitude and a keenness for our children to be in school as much as possible.

Your legal responsibilities are clear: you must make sure that your child attends regularly (and that means every day) and on time.

The Park Lane Attendance Policy is being reviewed over the summer in the light of the changes in government guidance, and we will make clear what the changes in the policy are, what our responsibilities as a school are and what your responsibilities as parents are, when we issue it in the new school year to ensure that we can continue to work together on this.

We understand that there are barriers in the way for some children that mean attendance is difficult, and we will support you in overcoming these issues; we ask that you communicate clearly, openly and honestly with us so that we know how to support you and your child. We need to know when your child is not going to attend school and the reasons for it - by 9am each day that they are absent. This means that you must contact us each and every day with a detailed reason for their absence. You can contact us in a number of ways to give us this information: by calling in on the phone, by emailing the office, or by sending us a message on the Teachers2Parents app (which you can download from phone app stores).

As a school, we expect children to attend every day, on time, ready to sit down and learn by 8.45am. These standards are a shared priority between our Families and School to ensure that our children can thrive in school. As always, we will work together to ensure that this is the case and please do let us know if there is anything that we can do to support you with this.

Thank you to all those who attended and we look forward to welcoming you officially on Wednesday 7th September.








