

Our Summer term has been filled with lots of creativity and of course, all things art. Reception participated fully in the GAF festival and thoroughly enjoyed it. The event takes place over two weeks where this year we focused on the topic of Family and created various pieces of artwork towards it. We discussed what the word '*Family*' meant to us and how this was different for everyone. The word '*Home*' came up a lot in our discussions, and this was how our very first GAF piece was created, utilising a range of materials to present.

To apply previous learning, we completed Acrostic Poems using the words 'love' and 'family.' We also created beautiful family trees for each class using photographs from home - we thank you for your support with this. To finish off our GAF artwork, we created our very own Reception Family where the children drew themselves with their family from school. What a fantastic fortnight to finish off a fabulous year!

Reception have been a phenomenal cohort throughout this year: from their very first few days in school, we knew that they were unique and they have flourished gracefully as each day has passed. We know that they will continue to impress next year in Year 1 and we wish them the very best. Thank you to our Reception Families for all of your support.






Year 1

This half term, Year 1 have created some lovely artwork for the Griffin Arts Festival. We began by creating finger family canvases: the children created their family using a finger-painting technique which they then drew on their facial features and named each member of their family. The children will then be able to take these beautiful canvases home to display in their homes.

We then created symmetry art, whereby the children sketched the other half of their family photos. The children then coloured their symmetry art, ensuring it was identical to the other half of their photograph. Furthermore, the children chose to write a family acrostic poem as they really enjoy creating them. They created their poem by thinking of their favourite words to describe their family - it was wonderful to see how creative the children were and how they were able to apply their learning throughout the year to this activity.

It's been an incredible year for our Year 1 children as they have matured from continuous provision to a more 'enhanced' formal provision, preparing them for their start in Year 2. They are going to be brilliant and we cannot wait to watch on as they continue to blossom - be very proud Year 1!



Year 2 started the Griffin Arts Festival by looking at the word '*Family*'. We discussed what family meant to us and came up with a variety of answers which included family members, friends, love, safety, happiness, pets and many more. We decided that we would create performance poetry for our families. We watched Michael Rosen perform some of his poems and listened to him talk about what makes a good performance. We worked hard on trying to be really confident when we were performing. We hope you enjoyed our family poem performances on Seesaw.

For our 2 pieces of art work, we identified members of our family that lived in our house and created a plan for our pebble families in our sketch books. We used the glue gun to stick the pebbles to the canvas; we had to be really careful so we did not burn our fingers! For our second piece of art, we focused on skills that we had learnt in our art lessons inspired by *Romare Bearden* – creating collages of silhouette families in a sunset. We worked hard to try and ensure that we'd left no gaps in our collages, then we carefully cut them out and created our family silhouettes.

It's been such a rewarding year watching as our Griffins have embraced the formalities of life in a Year 2 classroom. We know that they are so ready for the challenges that await them as they approach Key Stage 2 - very well done Year 2!

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In Year 3 for GAF we have explored the art of graffiti and street art. We thought of various visual symbols to represent family and worked together to create large graffiti style pictures, using acrylic paint sticks. We also did some work on photography. In groups, we considered what family means to us, and took pictures to represent this: the black and white photos were then compiled into collages.

As part of our theme of Family, we looked at portraits painted by the Romanian artist *Ilan Korda*, and then painted our own family portraits in the same style. As part of our parent workshop, we each painted a brightly coloured feather, then assembled them into wings to represent our class family.

It's been a fantastic year for our Year 3 Griffins and we know that they will approach life in Year 4 with maturity, perseverance and confidence, as they have done throughout this year.

Year 4

The Griffin Arts Festival this year was especially exciting for Year 4: this was because, not only were they exposed to a wide variety of art forms, but they also worked towards gaining an Arts Award certificate at Discover Level too. The children documented all of their experiences in their Arts Award portfolios to use as evidence towards their awards. The portfolios will be assessed at the start of the next academic year and certificates will be issued to all who met the set criteria.

Across the fortnight, the children revisited some of the skills learnt throughout the year and applied these to new pieces of work. They created still life sketches, using tone and shade to make their paintings more realistic. They developed their techniques in sculpting, creating wire models of their family members. They also explored various forms of poetry and had a go at creating their own poems. Most notably, the children improved their ability to speak aloud. During

our Y4 assembly and the Griffin Arts Festival showcase, we were so proud of how the children delivered their lines with such confidence, projecting their voices and truly putting on a show.

It's been quite an unsettled time for our Year 4 children as they have had to embrace the changes that were before them. We hope that they enjoyed their trip to Drayton Manor and know that they will approach life in Year 5 with the same level of determination and courage.

Year 5 had an extremely busy GAF this year. Some of our pupils were fortunate enough to be a part of the Birmingham GAF, while the remainder of the children engaged in activities relating to the Arts in school. Our first activity was portrait sketching. Some children had brought in photos of their families that they sketched, while the rest created sketches of our Year 5 Griffin family. We had printed half of each child's face and they sketched the other half using techniques that we had learned in our art lessons, such as stippling, shading and blending. The results were simply stunning. Our second activity involved clay sculptures. The children rolled out clay that was the same thickness as their hand. They cut around their hand and then after adding detail, bent the fingers to give the appearance of a hand that was holding something. Then, they created little sculptures of their families which they placed on their hand.

Year :

The children had all been given the same instructions, but each of their sculptures were very different. The sculptures represent how different families are in reality. The children worked extremely hard and the results were very effective. Thank you to the parents who joined their children to help with these creations as part of our GAF workshop. Finally, two of our Year 5 Griffins, Kaitlyn and Daniel, choreographed a dance for all of year 5 to learn as their performance piece to the song 'Family.' It was fabulous and our children really enjoyed dancing to it. Well done Kaitlyn and Daniel.

Overall, it was a thoroughly enjoyable GAF and the work produced was outstanding. Well done Year 5: we are excited for you to embrace the challenges that await as you approach the final year of your Park Lane journey.





For the Griffin Arts Festival this year, Year 6 decided to create a dress made entirely from their family pictures. During their art lessons this term, the children were exploring photography including how to capture engaging images as well as how to edit them, so this project progressed their previous learning from their photography module. Further to this, children also experimented with origami by creating roses (to decorate the dress) and T-shirts to create their own sporting family.

Additionally, the children created palindrome poems based on their home families. The children enjoyed creating these poems as they initially began by writing controversial things to then reveal their true meaning/message once they are read from the bottom to the top. Their performance this year was a fantastic rendition of '*Hey Brother – Avicii*'. The children thoroughly enjoyed performing this song and they did a great job on the day to showcase their skills.
