Mini Griffins

This term Mini Griffins have been learning all about their new friends during our first half-term of school. We have been exploring how creative we can be by painting our faces using mirrors, drawing pictures of our families and using play dough to add features to our faces. We have also enjoyed exploring our senses in Forest School lessons: exploring our environment using our eyes, ears and hands to learn and talk about the nature around us.

The lovely Autumnal weather is upon us and we have been enjoying being outdoors exploring the natural resources such as leaves and conkers. The children have loved having access to these resources across the classroom and using them in our Continuous Provision: communicating about them and applying their senses.

We're really looking forward to continuing with our learning after half-term as we approach our favourite time of the year, Christmas! What a fantastic start to the year our Mini Griffins have had: we are excited to observe them flourish throughout their time with us.



Pre-School have had a busy first term indeed, settling into new routines and exploring all areas of the environment.

We have explored the wider areas of school and searched for autumn treasures and turned these into wonderful natural self portraits. We have explored paint and colours to paint ourselves, carefully matching our features, such as skin tone, hair and eye colour. Our Pre-School Griffins have used our topic of '*Can We Be Friends*' to learn about ourselves, others and our differences as well as showing our positive attitudes and school values of kindness, tolerance and respect to one other.

We have had lots of fun learning in messy and creative ways such as in 'gloop', building houses using various natural materials and designing cards for our friends, to name but a few.

What a fantastic start to your Griffin Journey: we are excited to see what next term brings!

Reception

The first term in Reception, our children showed us just how unique and hardworking they are. They have settled into Park Lane so beautifully and we could not be more proud!

We have been looking at Autumn during our first half-term: we have discussed the changes we see outside and what happens to trees. The children have created beautiful artwork to go with all that they have learnt, such as hedgehogs, leaves, and the colours we see all around us during this season. They have also been on many walks around the woods to collect leaves, sticks and conkers, which they have thoroughly enjoyed!

We also had our Griffins Sport Festival, which all of the children absolutely loved: they took part in trampolining, cycling and many other sports activities. Reception have also been learning some new songs in class called My Lighthouse, Rise Up and the Wellerman song which we will continue to look at in the new term.

What an amazing start to the year, Reception! You have each shown determination, courage and resilience: each of these being core Griffin qualities.





Year

In Year 1 this half term, we have been exploring the topic 'Dinosaur Planet'. We have really enjoyed discovering the Science and History of dinosaurs and life on planet Earth millions of years ago.


Through this topic we have learnt about a significant individual, Mary Anning, and the role she played in the discovery of fossils and what these taught us about dinosaurs. We have learnt about the diets of different dinosaurs and classified dinosaurs by these diets as well as other key features and characteristics. The children have enjoyed carrying out lots of independent learning choices about dinosaurs including a fossil dig, building skeletons and sorting dinosaurs in different ways. What a fantastic start to year 1 we have had!

A great start to the year Year 1: your independence within your learning is serving you well!

Year 2

This half-term our topic was 'Land Ahoy' through which we have explored a pirates way of life within our Creative Curriculum. In our History lessons we have investigated the lives of famous pirates, creating individual projects to present our knowledge. Year 2 have created fact files around their favourite historic figure, acted out life on board a ship, and created pastel selfportraits turning themselves into pirates which hang proudly outside of our classrooms.

During our Geography lessons we have explored our senses, and began categorising structures into human or environmental, which we were fantastic at. In Science we worked together to hypothesise and test the best materials to make a pirate ship, and although different groups decided on different materials we were all able to make our boats float! We have really enjoyed learning in a variety of ways, and cannot wait to explore our next topic.





Year

In Year 3 we have very much enjoyed our Scrumdiddlyumptious topic within our creative Curriculum. We have been investigating a range of exotic fruits and learning about where they come from. We got very messy in the forest area when we followed the instructions for a recipe to make mud pies. We did get to follow a real recipe and made yummy pancakes topped with fruit and chocolate spread.

Our favourite lesson was when we got to taste different chocolate bars and voted on which we thought was best. We also looked at the design of different chocolate packaging and designed our own chocolate bar wrapper.

It has been a delicious topic!

A fantastic start to the year Year 3: your very first half-term in Key Stage 2 and you have completed it showing determination to succeed and passion towards your learning. Well done!



This half-term, Year 4 have had a fantastic time learning all about the digestive system! We learnt all about the scientific names of the body parts - oesophagus was a particular favourite.

To begin with, we identified the different types of teeth and their functions. Then, we followed the foods journey through the body, learning all about each parts function and how it helps our body to digest the food we eat! We definitely feel more confident in our scientific knowledge of the body.

A fabulous start to the year Year 4 - be very proud and continue to show this same attitude towards your studies as you progress through the year!

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Our creative curriculum topic for this half term is called '*Stargazers.*' As the title suggests, it is all about Space and Year 5 have been studying how the Russians and Americans battled to launch someone into space and onto the moon. The children have created and researched a timeline of events leading up to Neil Armstrong's walk on the moon in 1969. Year 5 have also been researching Galileo, who was a famous scientist from the 16th century. He was instrumental in discovering that the Earth orbits the Sun (it had been though that the Sun orbited the moon till then).

Finally, the children have been exploring the different phases of the moon and have learned that the moon takes 28 days to orbit the Earth: they have each created work to show the phases. In Geography, Year 5 have been recognising different countries from their shape from photographs from space. Some countries are easier to identify from others and the children could also identify densely populated areas, such as cities, from the lights that glow at night-time.

You have certainly shown many Griffin qualities, such as curiosity, independence and resourcefulness. Well done for working so hard Year 5!

Year 6

In Year 6 this half-term, our topic focus has been 'Stargazers'. From this, the children have taken the opportunity to explore the significant astronomer 'Galileo' where they each created a fact file all about him. The children not only investigated his early life but also his significant findings and discussed the impact Galileo had made on how we now view the universe.

Ranveer in 6SM has reported, 'Galileo has inspired us to learn more about spo and when we are completing our own work to never give up. Try, try and try again until we accomplish our dreams.'

Furthering their learning into our topic, the children spent time understanding the key events of the space race between USSR and USA. They enjoyed discovering all about Laika (the first dog that went into space) and the steps that came before the famous moon landing in 1969 by Neil Armstrong.

Through our learning, we regularly came back to the significant question of 'Is the Earth flat or round?' To target the learning at the children's curiosities, Year 6 completed a 'For and Against' argument using evidence to debate whether the Earth was actually flat or round.

We are so proud of all the effort the children have been putting in every day and this has been reflected in the progress they have already began to make. Keep it up, Year 6!

The Nurture Team

This half term Nurture groups have been focusing on our social understanding using different role play scenarios. Our Griffins have also enjoyed some Halloween craft, including pumpkin cube making and decorating boiled eggs with spooky Halloween faces. As we've moved into the Autumn months, our Nurture groups have been exploring the outdoors, going on nature walks and have sought things such as conkers and acorns. We have described them during our metaphor check ins.


