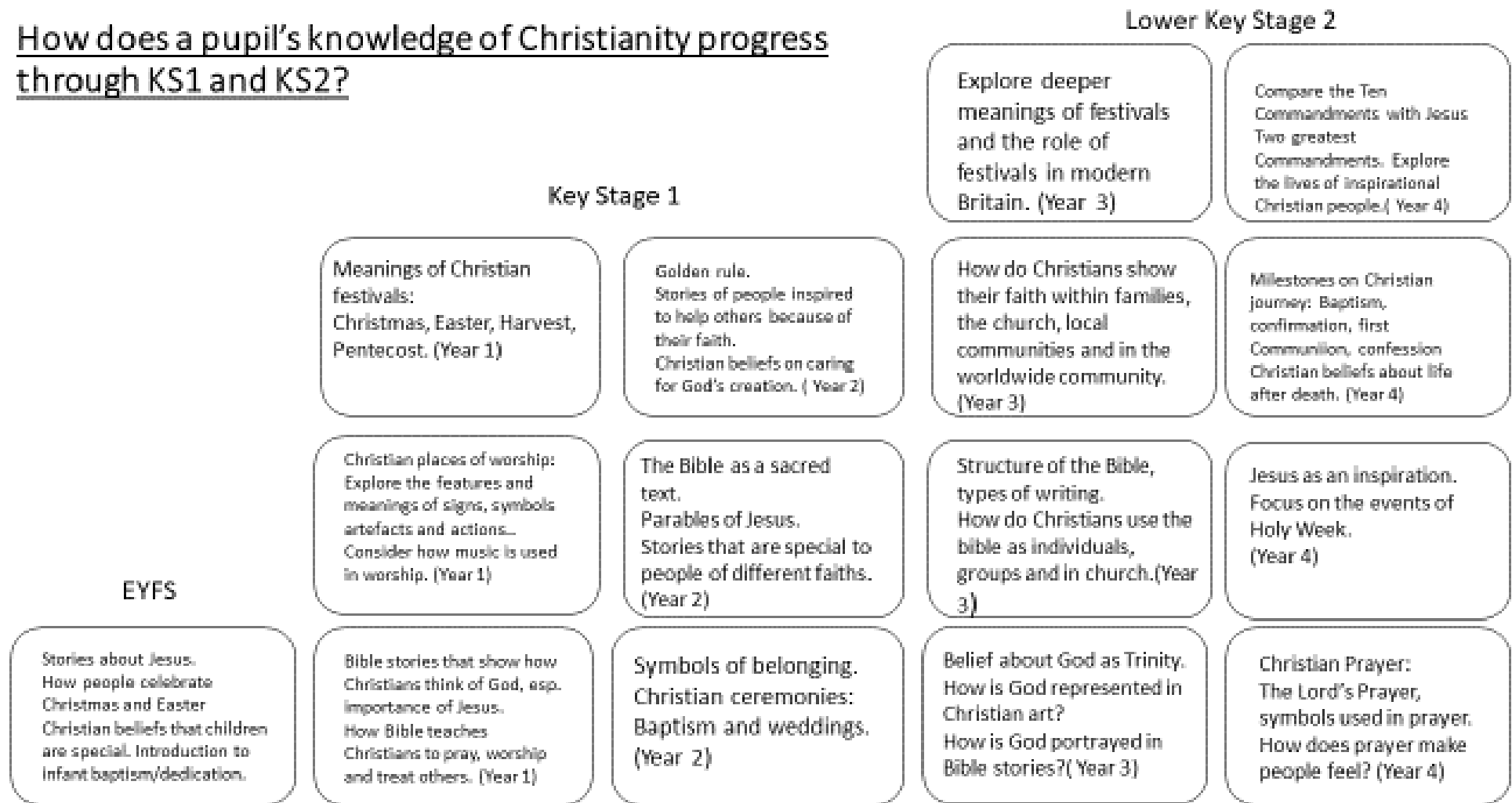


Religious Education Progression of Skills

How does a pupil's knowledge of Christianity progress through KS1 and KS2?



Religious Education Progression of Skills

Upper Key Stage 2

Explore the meaning of Grace in Christianity and how this is illustrated in Jesus' life and teaching. Discuss what difference Grace makes in the lives of Christians. (Year 6)

Compare differences between Anglican and Baptist churches. Explore why Christians view the people as the church/body of Christ. Learn about alternative forms of Christian communities. (Year 5)

Use the story of Creation and the Fall to explore why people do good and bad things. Explore what values are most important to Christians and compare these to personal values. (Year 6)

Explore how Jesus saw his mission. Use the themes of love, forgiveness, justice and fairness and generosity to examine "What would Jesus do?" (Year 5)

Compare Christian views about art and architecture and giving to charity. (Year 6)

Explore names and metaphors for God in the Bible. Compare how different Christians understand Genesis. (Year 5)

Explore in greater depth key concepts about Christian views on life after death. Consider similarities and differences in ceremonies that mark the end of life. (Year 6)

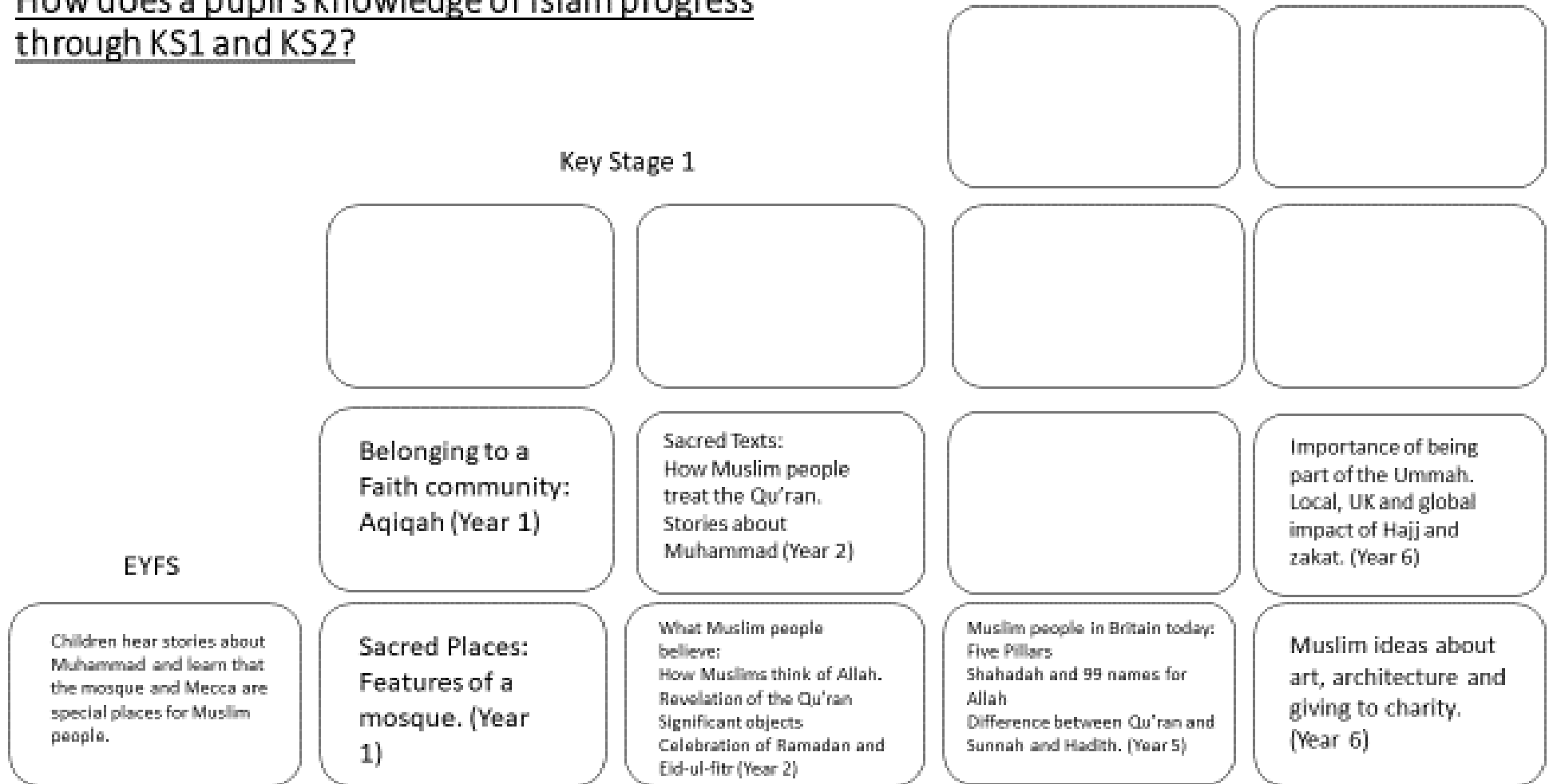

How does a pupil's knowledge of Judaism progress through KS1 and KS2?

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Compare welcoming ceremonies: zaved habit. Symbolism and ritual in Jewish wedding ceremonies. (Year 1)

Link creation story in Genesis with human responsibility to care for the world. Tikkun olam and Tu B'shevat. (Year 2)

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Jewish festivals: Shabbat, Pesach, Chanukah and Sukkot. (Year 1)

Torah/Tenakh Explore stories which teach about God looking after his people. (Year 2)

Rules for living: Ten commandments, Talmud teachings on thankfulness (Year 4)

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Special stories eg David the shepherd boy. Special times eg Sukkot Creation story

Sacred places: Features of a synagogue and meaning of signs, symbols, artefacts and actions. (Year 1)

Jewish beliefs about God: The Shema. Significance of Shabbat in the home. (Year 2)

Milestone ceremonies: Bar/bat mitzvah Jewish beliefs about life after death (Year 4)

Sacred Places: Compare synagogue with places of worship from other faiths. Western Wall Destruction of Jewish temple Meaning of synagogue/schul. (Year 5)
